



Methodology: polling

- J.L. Partners polled a representative sample of 651 registered Republicans and undeclared voters who will definitely request a ballot in the New Hampshire 2024 presidential primary (likely voters)
- Fieldwork dates of 17th-21st January 2024
- Sample drawn from a modelled universe of likely voters drawn from a state voter file, collected using mixed methods. In-app responses are drawn using
 river intercept sampling of internet/games traffic:
 - Live landline call for 187 responses (29%)
 - Live mobile call for 159 responses (24%)
 - SMS for 252 responses (39%)
 - In-app for 52 responses (8%)
- Quotas were added to ensure representative data: on gender, age, education, partisan registration (Republican or undeclared), race, congressional district, and participation in previous primary elections
- The sample was weighted back to the population using the following variables: gender, age, education, partisan registration (Republican or undeclared), race, and congressional district
- The share of Republicans-Undeclared voters (62%-38%) was determined through an initial scoping survey of 600 New Hampshire voters, ran 11th-13th January 2024
- The small number of undecided voters (28) were asked a lean question, answers to which were then re-allocated to the candidate of their choice for final headline voting intention
- Margin of error: 3.8%




Voting intention




Headline voting intention: Trump leads by 10 points




Voting intention with undecideds included




Donald Trump leads decisively with registered Republicans; Haley with undeclared voters




Trump leads with all age groups, particularly 18-35 year olds




Trump is marginally ahead with college-educated voters, and dominates with non-graduates



Trump leads amongst men and women, with Haley most competitive with men




Those who participated in just the 2022 primary are the most pro-Trump, whereas completely new voters lean Haley



Those undecideds asked a squeeze question were narrowly more likely to pick Haley


You said that you don't know who you would vote for. If you had to choose, who are you most leaning towards voting for?

The 24 people who said "Don't know"




Enthusiasm: Eight in ten Trump voters are very enthusiastic compared to 44% of Haley voters

How would you describe your level of enthusiasm voting for the candidate you have selected?


