



## Methodology


- J.L. Partners polled a representative sample of 550 registered Republicans and undeclared voters who would request a ballot in 2024 presidential primary.
  - Fieldwork dates of 10<sup>th</sup> April to 12<sup>th</sup> April 2023
  - Sample collected using mixed methods:
    - Live landline call for 198 responses (36%)
    - Live mobile call for 132 responses (24%)
    - SMS-to-web for 220 responses (40%)
  - Quotas were added to ensure representative data: on gender, age, education, partisan registration (Republican or independent), race, congressional district, and participation in previous primary elections
  - The sample was weighted back to the population using data on the same variables: on gender, age, education, partisan registration (Republican or independent), race, congressional district, and participation in previous primary elections
  - 5-minute survey
  - Margin of error: 4.2%




# Kari Lake holds a 28 point lead in the AZ Senate race, with Mark Lamb on 8%




# Trump primary voters back Lake by a large margin




# DeSantis primary voters give Lake a 16 point advantage over Robson




# Half of those who do not have a presidential primary preference are undecided about who to support




# In a head-to-head, Kari Lake has a 32 point lead over Mark Lamb for U.S. Senate






# Trump leads DeSantis by 23 points in the Arizona presidential primary




## In a head-to-head, Trump leads DeSantis by 17 points


# All registered Republicans who are likely to vote




# Lake is Arizona Republicans' preferred choice for VP, with Haley in second place




## Lake is the top choice for VP amongst Trump primary voters



## Haley is the top choice for VP amongst DeSantis primary voters




# Those who are not voting for Trump or DeSantis do not have a clear preference for VP







# The economy, elections and border security top the most important issues for primary voters




## Lake voters put election integrity as their major concern




# Robson and Lamb voters are more focused on the economy and inflation



# Undecided voters in the Senate race put the economy and the border top




# Amongst likely primary voters, Lake has the highest net favorability on +45 while Robson is on +3




## Amongst Trump primary voters, Lake has a +91 net approval rating


# Amongst DeSantis primary voters, Lamb has the highest net approval




## Those voting for neither Trump or DeSantis favor Robson




# Lake voters have a positive view of Lamb and a negative view of Robson



## Robson and Lamb voters lean negative on Lake




# Amongst undecideds in the Senate race, all candidates have a net positive rating




## Senate VI: by mode




# Senate VI: Lake vs Lamb: by mode




## Presidency VI: by mode




# Presidency VI: Trump vs DeSantis: by mode




